(Nursery available for 10:45 worship service for infants through four-year-olds) I was recently reading an article about how Americans have gone crazy over fitness trackers. Fitbit has sold millions of their devices-which come in a variety of options. This fitness craze has reminded me of a book that Leonard Sweet wrote several years ago, <u>The Jesus Prescription for a Healthy Life</u>. Sweet identifies ten health areas:

- 1. LAUGH A LOT Jesus was the master of puns. Who has a light and hides it under a bushel? I will make you fishers of men. I will build my church upon this Rock.
- 2. HANG OUT WITH FRIENDS Jesus had friends and by his life instructed that relationships are sacred. There is a healing power in friendship.
- 3. PLAY OUT THE CHILD IN YOU Jesus celebrated childhood and demonstrated the ability to view the world from the eyes of a child. Children loved him and flocked to him.
- 4. WALK DAILY Jesus was a walker. He called some fishermen to be his disciples while walking near the Sea of Galilee. Walking was not just exercise for Jesus-it was a ministry strategy.
- 5. MIND YOUR THOUGHTS Jesus minded his thoughts. Jesus knew the power of the mind. What you are inside, he insisted, is what you become outside.
- 6. SET THE TABLE Jesus spoke the language of food. He used food to teach, heal, build community, transform village life, and break down the walls of alienation. Jesus ate "good food with bad people."
- 7. ADOPT A SEE-YOU-AT-THE PARTY SPIRIT Jesus' mission statement was: "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."
- 8. COME APART, SO YOU DON'T COME APART Jesus dealt with stress by going out into nature to let the Father and nature revive him. He prayed. He created an alternating rhythm for his life.
- EMBRACE THE UNKNOWN Jesus loved surprises. He often used surprise as a metaphor to describe the kingdom of God. The parables that Jesus taught are loaded with surprises.
- 10. MOODLE ALONG THE WAY Marvel at a lake, a cloud formation, a garden, a starry sky, a bird singing its heart out. Wonder!




CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING AT FUMC
